MINUTES FOR MONTHLY MEETING 25th FEBRUARY, 2021

Text notifications

Tony referred to investigations as to whether a (mobile phone) text notification could be instituted for short notice notifications, eg. walk cancellations. This would mean loading all members mobile numbers into those phones which it is anticipated would send these messages, eg. Walk Coordinators. The answer is “No, too cumbersome, and some members do not have mobile phones.” Another method would be sought.

Elaine reported good but non-swimmable weather for the 27 participants who sat under the central trees enjoying a great variety of food.

Feb 04

Bus trip to Pelorous. 60 participants on 2 buses; thanks to Pete S driving the second.

Walk 1: Dalton's track plus Trig K circuit (one way) (M3)

This walk of approx. 7.5km for each part was deemed to be a little too demanding and could be altered should there be a 'next time'.

Walk 2: Dalton's track (one way) (E3)

23 potential fence-styles were a daunting prospect for some of the 30+ walkers, however 'Rescue' Gary worked out how to manage electric fences/gates on this enjoyable walk.

Walk 3: Pelorous Loop Nature Walk (E1)

Report by Gwen B (TEC). Richard led 20 walkers out on a circular walk of a wheelchair grade track to the bridge over the Rai river. Four turned back at this point and the track became rougher. Not much birdsong until near the beautiful Te Hoiere (Pelorous river). The track is part of the Te Araroa Trail.

Two more track excursions after lunch, a trickling waterfall, group photos and back to ice cream, tea and coffee at the campsite. A well lead walk!

Walk 1: Baton River (Loveridge Creek) (M3)

- **Walks and Steering Committee**

1. New Walks Email System

2. Regular emails in Spam box/Junk folder, or missing

It has come to our notice that, over the last month or so, a number of members have had 50+group emails turn up in their Spam box / Junk folder, or not received them at all. The cause of this is yet a mystery and we are working to resolve the issue.

3. PLB alert system

Should SAR authorities receive a PLB alert believed to come from our 50+Group, they will check with 1. David Lucas, 2. Tim Rich, for probable veracity of the alert before activating search and rescue resources. The Coppins contact is no longer available (but the discounts still are).

- **Health and Safety Matters**

First Aid Course

25 members have registered for the popular First Aid course. A further call will be made for members interested in due course. A Group subsidy will probably be able to be applied, making this a very cost-effective course.

- **General Business**

1. Away Trip 2021

Tony reported that 32 members have registered for the shorter ‘overnight mini’ trip to Mt Lunar (Collingwood area) for 14-15 April. There will be one walk at Group 2 pace: 5-6 hr, M3-H1. Those going will need to arrange their own accommodation in/ near Collingwood ready for a 0900 departure (or leave Motueka area very early!). More details closer to the date.

2. AGM Office Nominations

Most office holders have agreed to stand another term, which is laudable and appreciated. However, there has been no nominations received yet for the Group Secretary position, which terminates after two years at the end of September. As reported above, the new walks information dissemination system should see a marked reduction in workload for the Secretary, ie. to more of a monthly admin type job. Should this now make the position more attractive to any member (particularly with Word and Excel skills), please contact Ian M or Tony P before the AGM next month. Full training will be available in the 6-month cross-over period. If the position is not filled, monthly meetings will cease from October 2021. An email explaining this further will be sent out later today.

3. Submission to TDC re Motueka Community Swimming Pool

The Group (President) has been asked to give support to “the idea of a community swimming pool (with a good number of ‘bells and whistles’) in the TDC Long Term Plan, to be situated at Sports Park Motueka, adjacent to the Motueka High School swimming pool. Judy S indicated the High School collaboration (on Maori lease land) is apparently a non-starter, and the TDC would appear to only want to contribute if it had some say in ownership, particularly of the land. Likewise, any other major contributor, eg. Lotto, might want similar assurances.

The idea had merit, and as he was using such with another sports group, he volunteered to develop the initiative. Graham will liaise with Bob White to generate several copies of the scanning sheet which will be available at the Rec Centre walks gatherings.
