This includes giving the member a radio if the continuing group is small in number.

A page will be added to the website to record alterations to guidelines to be included in the next guideline review.

Further work is underway preparing a leader and TEC coaching day in the spring.

A website familiarisation course at senior net rooms is set for Saturday 16th of July and Monday 18th July.

We will plan to have some harder walks leading up to the Mt Arthur summit climb so people can increase their fitness and assess their capability of tackling the summit assault.

Mask wearing when car sharing should be determined by the driver or the individual concerned. We will endeavour to keep driving distances to walks as short as possible while Covid is still active in the community.
