- **Health and Safety Matters.**

Cathie reported on the following:-

- We have had a couple of injuries on walks in recent weeks. It is a reminder to all walkers to ensure you have your yellow medical card in your pack and that it is reasonably accessible. It is a good idea to laminate it – *a show of hands agreed we could organise this for the next meeting*
- First Aid course –we had 25 members attend the course and were ‘entertained’ by Danny and Debbie over the hour and a half. It covered Basic Life Support: DRSABC (read out), Strokes:FAST (read out), bleeding and fractures. Good reminders and it was interesting to hear members sharing medical facts about themselves that were relatively unknown. Another reinforcement for all walkers to ensure their medical form is up-to-date and that any medications they require are easily accessible.

GENERAL BUSINESS

- **Report from previous quarter’s walks** – rained out for four of the 12 walks in the past three months. Very grateful to have the low-lying walks such as Rabbit Island, Dicker Rd Circuit, Ruby Bay Hinterland etc as backups for walks that have had to be postponed due to the weather. Many thanks to Sarah Smeaton who took over the Land Partnership from Bob – a seamless transition and it also became a conduit for helping a landowner post flood.
- **Planning Committee Meeting** – Tony thanked Fran for holding the fort while he was away. He floated the idea of a second ‘bus trip’ to St Arnaud. He then updated the meeting on the changes that have been made to the August Walks programme with a warning that September walks would probably need to be adjusted as well. Bob and Mark are checking the Canaan Road, Karen will check the Scout Track and Tony has asked that ‘Walk 1 walkers’ would check the Abel Tasman Walkway.
- Two tracks on the Grampians are closed but walks will still be possible on other tracks up there. The road up to the Flora carpark is severely damaged so no walks up there. Kaiteriteri Bike Park has been badly effected but Easy Rider may be Ok to be included in a walk - Tony and Vivienne will recce.
- The next ‘Walks Committee’ meeting is on September 29th at 9.30 at the RSA. Tony will be stepping down as chairman at this meeting but is happy to continue as a committee member.
